J.J. College of Arts and Science (Autonomous), Sivapuram, Pudukkottai convened its 27th Graduation Day at 11.00 a.m. on 10.03.2024. 1522 Graduates belonging to the batch of 2020-2023 UG, 2021-2023 PG and corresponding M.Phil. and Doctoral Candidates received their degrees and were administered the graduation oath by the Principal. Dr. M.Selvam, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli delivered the Graduation Day Address.

He referred to Education as a flowering of the perfection in man. It had Intellectual, Emotional and Spiritual Dimensions. Universities should turn out complete men endowed with broad mind and sympathetic vision. Character is the essence of true education. On the empirical side education is the acquisition of practical skills and life skills. An educated man should know his own language to perfection. For example Tamils should speak tamil with the right pronunciation and cultured usage. One should respect one's own culture, even while acquiring competencies in Foreign Languages. Education today consists in acquiring Communication Competence, Computing Competence, Mathematical Skills, Reasoning Skills and the Ability to use ICT tools. These 5 skills are the basis on which one's domain knowledge should rest. So young men and women should not get distracted by temptations. They should focus on acquiring the above mentioned skills which will enable them to fit into various social and professional roles.

Earlier Thiru. N.Subramanian, J.J. Group of Institutions, Pudukkottai declared the graduation ceremony open. Dr. Kavitha Subramanian, Executive Trustee, Karpaga Vinayaga Educational Trust, Pudukkottai, welcomed the dignitaries, the Chief Guest and the fresh graduates and their parents through a poem in Tamil. Dr. J.Parasuraman, Principal presented the graduation day report. He highlighted the performance of the students in winning several University Ranks-as many as 26. He pointed out the college had turned out a research output of 118 journal articles besides 17 books by staff and several M.Phil. and Ph.D. theses. Finally he declared the graduation ceremony closed.
